Knowing the area

- Lady Bird Lake (Town Lake) -There are several access points to the 10 mile pedestrian biking and running trails around lake -- easiest access point is on the corner of Cesar Chavez and Congress Ave.
- **South Congress "SoCo"** It is a nationally known shopping and cultural district famous for its many eclectic small retailers, restaurants, music and art venues and, more recently, food trucks. Truly the heart of our city.
- Rainey Street Historic District: A neighborhood of "upcycled" 1930's style bungalow homes converted into hip, trendy bars and restaurants that are only one block from Lady Bird Lake, and just 4 blocks from the hotel.
- Warehouse District: Located just a couple of blocks north of the JW, and is filled with creative and attractive restaurants, bars and shops.

Second St. District: The neighborhood that surrounds us, and continues just east to the convention center and West past the W hotel. Also called "Willie Nelson Blvd", home to boutique shopping, unique restaurants, and the iconic ACL Moody Theater.
